John Nourse, of Lower Weston, Esq.
dated 3 December 1697



In the name of God Amen, I John Dourse of Lower Weston in the County of Herf Esqr being somewhat distempered in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto Almighty God considering the uncertainty of this life do make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following And first I commend my soul into the hands of God that gave it me and my body to be buried in Christian buryall according to the discretion of my Executrix hereafter named Also I give and bequeath unto Anna my daughter the summe of five hundred pounds And I give and bequeath unto Letice my other daughter the like summe of five hundred pounds to be paid to each of them with interest for the same at the rate of six pounds for every hundred pounds within the span of one yeare after my decease Also I give and bequeath unto Anne my dearly beloved wife all my store of cattle wine and grain whatsoever the better to make her advance my said two daughters fortunes And I do also give unto my said loving wife all my plate goods and household stuff whatsoever or at her ? to accept of the summe of one hundred pounds for the same from John my son she paying my debt and funeral expenses And I do give and devise unto my said son John and his heirs forever all my messuages lands tenements and indentures whatsoever and wheresoever in the said County of Herf And I do make and ordain my said beloved wife sole Executrix of this my last will and testament utterly revoking all former wills by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seale the third day of December in the ninth year of the Reigne of our Soveriegne Lord King William the third Anno Domini one thousand six hundred ninety seven ./..  any person or persons mentioned in this my will to stand to his
 arbitrament upon paine of losing the benefitt they might otherwise
 reap by any legacy herein given them In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal the 12th day of July one thousand
 six hundred ninety three and in the fifth year of the Reigne of our
 Sovereign Lord and Lady William and Mary of England King
 and Queen Defender of the Faith In signed sealed and delivered in the
